- <u>Highway Department Opening:</u> Highway Foreman applicants to be discussed in executive session. - Manager's Report
- <u>Simon Operation Monthly Report: August 2017</u> Activities Completed:
 - Re-installed fire hydrant on Meadow St./Gorham
 - Performed all compliance monitoring for water facility and samples tested passed state requirements.
 - Cleaned the chlorine and fluoride injection nozzles at the well house. Ordered replacement parts for the fluoride analyzer.
 - Typed and handed out lead and copper results with educational information to the participants. (only sampled homes receive information)
 - Weekly pool and Beaver Pond sampling. Completed for season.
 - State inspection was completed on the 10th for the fluoride chemical feed process.
 - Marked out the water main on East Street. Cleaned out 3 valve boxes and exercised. Hand delivered shut down notices.
 - Made repairs to 6-inch water main on East Street. Used a bell repair clamp and completed repairs on August 23rd.
 - Traced and marked utilities at 11 Pleasant Street. Abandoned property. Worked with contractor to replace corporation stop up to the curd stop. The line was left disconnected and shut off.
 - Marked utilities on Cain Street. Worked with contractor to repair leak. Also repaired sagging sewer main.

Activities in Progress

- Leak detection.
- Determine cause for lack of flow at the Willow Street hydrant. Suspect leaks now. Fluoride and chlorine are noted in the box culvert on Meadow Street. (2 locations) Storm water is making things difficult. Culverts have high flows now. The pressure is reduced all the way back to the isolation valve located on Meadow Street a (and Beech).
- Add a pressure reducing valve (PRV) at South Street vault to allow bypass operation without adversely increasing pressure. Met with engineer on site to look at the valve and determine possible installation methods.
- Get communication to East Tank corrected. Talking to Champlin about radio repair.
- Hydrant painting.

Activities Planned or Needed:

- Develop procedures and requirements for sub-contractors who assist with Town projects, including equipment list. Excavation projects are going out to bid.
- Hydrant flushing. Fall
- West Tank cathodic protection needs replacing.
- Fix leak on Pleasant Street service line. The property owner at #16 Pleasant Street has been notified several times about the leak and is disputing his liability for repairs. He is claiming leak detection process caused the leak.
- Fix leak on Terrace Hill service line.

- Hydrant study. Scheduled for September 12, 13 and 14th with D&K and Vermont Rural Water Association. Data will be used to develop a flow model.
- <u>Simon Operation Service Contract</u>: Awaiting a response from Simon's.
- <u>Overdue Water Accounts:</u> Delinquent accounts have a lien placed on the property. Selectboard proposed placing an article at Town Meeting to charge interest on late water/wastewater accounts.
- <u>Other New and/or Old Business:</u> Stan Wilbur reported there has been a reduction in water with leak repairs, 150,000 gallons per day to 125,000 gallons per day.

- <u>Simon Operation Monthly Report: August 2017</u> Activities Completed:
 - Performed compliance monitoring for WWTF and samples tested passed state requirements.
 - Replaced the sump pump at Willow Street pump station.
 - Added algaecide to the seconded cell in lagoon#2. The algaecide did have a positive affect bringing the ph and alkalinity into range.
 - Got quotes for tool boxes to be installed on the new truck and ordered.
 - Responded to request for service on Sunday the 20th. Sewer plug at #12 Olympus Road.
 - Camera work on Ormsbee and Park Street. Marked damaged sections for excavation. Scheduled September 6th for repairs.

Downloaded and sent rain and flow date from Willow Street data logger to Elliot & Aldrich.
Activities in Progress:

- Evaluate "problem areas" in collection system for possible slip line repair. A spreadsheet has been developed to track progress. A& E engineering will be assisting and has been retained.
- Camera work and root removal on Upper Park Street. Upper Park Street to Holden Avenue needs to be cleared.
- Complete manhole to manhole evaluation spreadsheet and use it to assist with evaluating and identifying problem areas in the sewer collection system. Copies of all the files has been given to A&E, including videos.
- Sludge Depth profiles are in progress. A depth finder was purchased to provide depth readings in 2 lagoons.

Activities Planned or Needed:

 Ormsbee Avenue repair. Pipe is broken and allowing dirt and debris into the main. Not all roots can be removed, in the area, due to large hole in pipe. Continued flushing only makes hole larger and pushes more debris into the pipe. Video of hole provided. The engineer's evaluation has been completed.

- Repairs to Park Street Sewer Main. (In front of #9 Lower Park) Large roots were removed from a hole in the top of the pipe. Hole is in front of the service. This pipe is a good candidate to slip line as the pipe is now cleared and intact. A& E has been notified of this.
- Repairs to Upper Park. MH.2.E.9, specially 2 holes in the pipe between MH.2.E.7 and MH.2.E.8(below r4ecenlty repaired area at #104 Park.) Video shows significant amount of ground water flowing into the holes. A&E has been updated on this.
- Repairs to pipe below MH#2.E.7 are scheduled for September 6th
- Investigate and repair the Willow Street Pump Station. Water occasionally surfaces. We believe there is a hole in the pipe.
- Review and update sewer ordinances.
- o Root removal in several sections of pipe-ongoing mostly due to necessity.
- o Root removal on the sewer main crossing vacant lot on North Street.
- Camera work on sewer line from High Street to Main Street. A-1 is checking service line. No word from A-1 yet.
- Investigate seal fail alarms at Library Pump Station. Removal and rebuild of pump is scheduled.
- <u>Simon Operation Service Contract:</u> See Board of Water Commissioners.
- <u>Overdue Sewer Accounts</u>: See Board of Water Commissioners.
